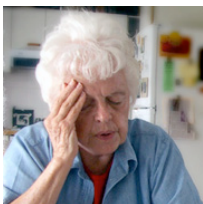

Our new trip got started. It is called "Psalms".

With Psalm 1 we possibly travel 2960 years back in time.

"Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers.

But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.

He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.

Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.

Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.

For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish."

Even then those, who did not make themselves dependant on the counsel of the ungodly, who did not get permeated with the ideas of sinners and who had enough guts to say "no" to the company of scoffers were called lucky.

Why?

Two reasons come to my mind.

First one is psychological. It's difficult to do things God's way when "everybody else" does otherwise. We tend to agree with worldviews represented by the majority. Things seem right when others believe them to be so. Well, against the opinion of the majority Copernicus insisted that the Earth does not stand still in space. He was just one. Yet he was right. If you have enough courage to stand for God's truth, even alone, that's great. You're lucky!
